Prior to the show, Howard and Guggenheim told the audience a little about the history of theatre.

Long ago, theatre troupes traveled from town to town by horse and wagon because there were no motor vehicles. And because there was no electricity, they lit the stage using lanterns.

That is how The Traveling Lantern Theatre Company got its name.

"The Hobbit" was part of the Derby Public Library's summer reading program and was sponsored by the Leonard and Celia Levand Trust, the South Central Kansas Library System and the libraries of Sedgwick County.

Howard played Bilbo Baggins the Hobbit, while Jonathan jumped


